ITINERARY

Day 1 - Arrive Bangkok

You will be welcomed by an airport representative at the meeting point. Then private transfer without guide to your hotel in Bangkok.

Meeting point at Bangkok-Suvarnabhumi Airport: International arrival: gate number 06.

Arrive at your hotel, check-in and free time at leisure.

Day 2 - Bangkok Sightseeing

Enjoy breakfast at your hotel, meet your guide at hotel lobby and private transfer to enjoy your half day city temples tour in Bangkok.

Your day begins at Wat Traimit, also known as the Temple of the Golden Buddha. Visit the world's largest solid gold Buddha statue and be awe-inspired by its spirituality and artistry. Standing at an impressive 10 feet tall and weighing approximately 5.5 tons, this masterpiece reflects the pinnacle of Thai craftsmanship, enveloping you in the cultural and religious heritage of Thailand.

As your exploration continues, venture to Wat Pho, a timeless sanctuary that has stood since the late 17th century, predating Bangkok's rise as Thailand's capital. Delve into the captivating history of King Rama I, who revitalised the temple, leaving behind a legacy embodied by the illustrious Reclining Buddha. Stretching an impressive 46 meters in length, this reclining position symbolises Buddha's entry into Nirvana. Beyond the iconic Reclining Buddha, discover a labyrinth of chedis, a scripture hall, and a library, guarded by the imposing Wat Pho Giants. For those seeking relaxation, Wat Pho offers an on-site massage centre (at an additional cost) that showcases the temple's longstanding connection to traditional massage.

End of your trip, return to hotel and free time at leisure.

By approx. 5pm, Hop on public transportation (self-arrange) to Krung Thep Aphiwat Central Terminal. The nearest connecting station is MRT Bang Sue.

Your train from Bangkok is Train no.09, 2nd class - sleeping train, departure from Bangkok at approx. 6:40pm, arrive at Chiang Mai at 7:15 am (next day).

You will be welcomed by a driver at the arrival hall holding a sign with your name. Private transfer (without a guide) to your hotel.

Optional Tour - Bangkok / Chinatown Walking Food Tour, Pak Khlong Talat Flower Market and Sala Rattanakosin Rooftop Bar

At approx. 5:30pm, meet your guide in the hotel lobby for a journey to the heart of Bangkok's Chinatown, renowned as one of the world's premier food destinations.

Indulge your taste buds with a refreshing platter of tropical fruits, featuring mango, mangosteen, rambutan, and guava. Delight in satay pork, a Southeast Asian favourite originating from Indonesia, and savour a trio of fruit juice tasters, including sweet orange, persimmon, and pomegranate.

Pad See Ew noodle dish served with a chilled Chang beer is a must-try for those looking to experience Thai gastronomy. Conclude your Chinatown culinary exploration on a sweet note with the beloved Mango Sticky Rice.

Then, explore Bangkok's primary flower market, Pak Klong Talat, where vibrant colours and bustling activity create a sensory feast. Open 24 hours a day, this market offers a kaleidoscope of blooms sold to wholesalers and the public alike. Dive into the local culture as you witness street hawkers crafting floral garlands, symbols of luck and devotion.

A rooftop bar nestled along Bangkok's Chao Phraya River is the perfect way to end your evening. Unwind while sipping a cocktail at an iconic Buddhist temple, Wat Arun, and admire the panoramic views of the city.

- Chinatown operates at limited capacity on Mondays.
- Please note that access to the rooftop bar at Sala Rattanakosin involves several steps. If the group requires an alternative, we will seamlessly transition to another rooftop bar.

Optional Tour - Bangkok / Damnoen Saduak Floating Market & Mae Klong Railway Market

Start your day at 7:00am for a morning tour by meeting your English-speaking guide at your hotel lobby. You will be driven to Ratchaburi Province which is approximately a 2-hour drive away.

The Damnoen Saduak Floating Market is one of Thailand's most famous and picturesque markets. This bustling market, a 24-hour spectacle, paints a vivid picture of Thailand's cultural tapestry. As flowers change hands between wholesalers and locals, witness street hawkers transforming them into garlands, symbols of luck and offerings. You will have the opportunity to experience the long tail boat and cruise along the river while you try exciting new local dishes.

Next, you will be driven to The Mae Klong Railway Market. This unique market is set up right on the active railway tracks, this vibrant market is a thrilling spectacle as vendors deftly move their goods to make way for passing trains. Experience this captivating routine eight times a day, showcasing the resilience of the local community.

Return to your hotel with vivid memories, relishing the unique charm of Mae Klong. Enjoy leisure time, reflecting on the day's extraordinary moments and the unexpected wonders that make this market a must-see destination.



Optional Tour - Bangkok / Kanchanaburi & War Cemetery, Death Railway Museum, River Kwai Bridge & Train Ride

At 7:00am, meet your guide at the hotel lobby and embark on a 2-3 hour drive to Kanchanaburi (130km).

Discover the town's rich history, initially a Thai army outpost against Burmese forces. During World War II, Kanchanaburi gained notoriety as the site of the Death Railway, a construction project connecting Thailand and Burma, where prisoners of war faced harsh conditions.

Visit the iconic Kwai Yai Bridge, known globally as the 'Bridge over the River Kwai.' Take a reflective walk across this historic bridge, soaked in the memory of the Death Railway.

Explore The Thailand-Burma Railway Centre, featuring the privately funded Death Railway Museum. With nine exhibitions, delve into the history, conditions, and life of prisoners during the construction. The museum, housed in the former Japanese Army headquarters, stands as a testament to this dark period.

Across the road, pay your respects at the Allied War Cemetery, the final resting place for 6,982 prisoners of war. A light walk here allows reflection on the historical insights gained.

Lunch will be served at a local restaurant.

Embark on a train ride over the "Death Railway Trail," symbolising the harrowing history of the Burma Railway during World War II.

After a day of historical exploration, drive back to Bangkok.

Please note: the Death Railway Museum may be emotionally intense for visitors.

Optional Tour - Chiang Mai / Private Evening Street Food Tour by Tuk Tuk

Depart at approx. 6pm, meet your guide at hotel lobby.

Get into a tuk-tuk and explore Chiang Mai's street food delights that evening with your guide at the hotel. Chiang Mai stands out for its lively street food scene, offering a rich variety of delectable dishes served from stalls and carts scattered throughout the city.

Popular street food choices in Chiang Mai encompass Khao Soi, Moo Ping, Som Tum, Roti, Khanom Krok, and Pad Thai.

Embrace the opportunity to venture into local flavours and fearlessly explore something new!

Optional Tour - Chiang Mai / Private Half Day Tour - Wat Doi Suthep

Departs at either 8:30am or 12:30pm: meet your guide at hotel lobby.

Begin your day by meeting your guide at the hotel and embarking on a journey to Wat Doi Suthep.

Nestled atop Doi Suthep, a mountain that overlooks Chiang Mai, Wat Doi Suthep stands as a revered Buddhist temple and one of the most significant and picturesque in northern Thailand. Renowned for its remarkable architecture, intricate details, and a golden chedi (stupa) that enshrines relics of the Buddha, the temple offers a captivating spiritual experience. To reach this sacred site, you can ascend a staircase adorned with beautiful naga (serpent) statues, totalling over 300 steps, or opt for the convenience of a tram. Once at the summit, the temple provides an awe-inspiring panoramic view of Chiang Mai and the surrounding countryside.

After your visit to Wat Doi Suthep, return to the hotel and enjoy free time at your leisure.



Optional Tour - Chiang Mai / Chiang Mai by Night - Vespa Evening Tour

See how local Chiang Mai residences spend their evenings on this thrilling night-time vespa tour. This tour will take guests through the local markets and old lanes of Chiang Mai and will incorporate some much-loved food and drink experiences. Begin your tour with a visit to Kad Kom Market, a more local market not as well known to tourists, where we will first enjoy some local pork crackling and local beer whilst watching the locals buzzing between the stalls. Continue on the vespa through the small winding streets of the city, zipping between neighbourhoods to discover the diverse nightlife of Chiang Mai.

Try some local BBQ before heading to a small venue where you will learn to make som tam, a papaya salad well known in local northern Thai cuisine. Get back on the vespa and head over the iron bridge which sits over the Ping River, before enjoying a Thai dinner at a local restaurant.

We will end our tour with a visit to watch some live music, either at Boy Blues Bar or Jazz Café, where we will also enjoy a local beer or cocktail.

If you are happy to leave at 10pm, you will be transferred back to your hotel, or alternatively, continue to enjoy your evening into the small hours (guests will however need to make their own way back home).

Muay Thai matches offer spectators the opportunity to enjoy the electrifying atmosphere and watch the athleticism and artistry of the fighters as they battle it out.

It's an excellent opportunity to fully immerse yourself in Thai sporting culture and witness the thrilling spectacle of this martial art up close.
